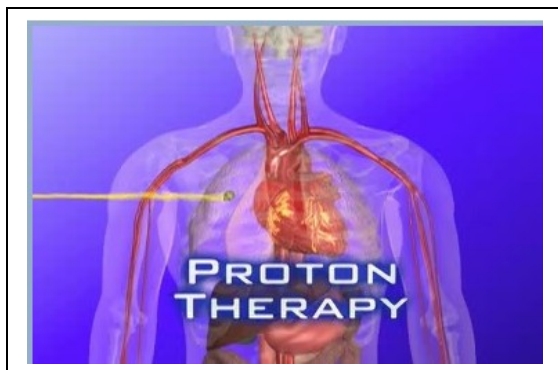

What is Proton Beam Therapy?



Loma Linda University Medical Center started Proton Beam Therapy in 1990. **Proton Therapy is NOT experimental. Proton Therapy IS COVERED in the U.S. by MEDICARE and most insurance providers.**

It is the most precise form of radiation treatment available; radiates primarily the tumor site, leaving surrounding healthy tissue and organs intact and unharmed. It is non-invasive, painless, maintains quality-of-life lifestyle during treatment process on an out-patient basis. Patients carry on normal activities. Amazingly it has minimum to no side effects resulting from treatment.

Therapy often used in conjunction with other cancer treatments. Treatment time can take from one day to 9+ weeks depending on affected site.

Proton Beam Therapy has been proven to be highly effective in treating children with tumors sparing side effects and trauma. In addition, it is highly effective treatment for tumors in the **head, brain, neck, lung, breast and prostate**. Proton Beam Radiation Therapy can be used in areas of the body that cannot be operated on such as: **lungs, liver, kidneys, the esophagus, the rectum, sarcomas**, and others. Cure Prostate Cancer in 60 Minutes!

When I went in for my physical, my PSA number was 4.9. My doctor (family physician) told me I did not have cancer because my prostate was smooth. (Lumpy, bumpy or sharp prostates are another indicator of cancer) I still requested a biopsy. 11 out of 12 of my biopsy samples were cancerous.

My doctor at Loma Linda said I had cancer for at least 8 years and if it were a fast growing cancer I could have died 3 years ago. A Free PSA test would have shown I had cancer much sooner.

My treatments at LLUMC were 1 ½ minutes each 5 days a week. I had a total of 44 treatments. Six months after treatment my PSA was 0.7. One year after, my PSA is 0.4.

Early detection is everything. Thank God I requested a biopsy. Thank God I had a slow growing cancer. Thank God for Proton Therapy.

Early Diagnosis is the Key! Free PSA vs. PSA Tests

- Both tests measure the amount of **protein** in your body.
 - PSA Tests measure the amount of **protein** attached to body parts.
 - 1 – 4 is normal. Higher is abnormal.
 - Will escalate with vigorous exercise, sexual activity or strong drugs within **72 hours** of a blood test, which can create a false positive.
 - 220,000 false positives per year in the US which result in unnecessary biopsies costing as much as \$1500/ea.
 - Free PSA Tests measure the **protein** floating '**free**' in your bloodstream.
 - 25% – 30% is normal. Lower is abnormal.
 - 15% needs a biopsy.
 - 10% or less usually indicates cancer.
 - Does not fluctuate as easily as PSA
 - Has fewer false positives which means fewer biopsies!

230,000 Men as young as 39 years old are Diagnosed with Prostate Cancer Each Year

Traditional therapy options include:

- **Surgical Removal** – Annually, 30,000 men relapse or the cancer cannot be fully removed.
- **Freezing** – difficult to control and contain to just the cancer cells
- **Radiation Seeds** - 17% of the seeds used for traditional radiation therapy flow through the body. The seeds can collect and burn holes inside the body – even the heart!

An estimated 30,000 men who have had surgical removal of prostate cancer will relapse each year and many will not survive. But many of these patients can be saved by Proton Beam Radiation Treatment at the earliest signs of recurrence. If surgical removal fails, the only two options left are hormone therapy and radiation (which creates scar tissue). Both of these methods are only short term solutions and the cancer will eventually spread again.

The latest study, published by the American Medical Association, looked at 500 men who were given Proton Beam Radiation Therapy in lieu of hormones. This study suggests that many of these men can be cured with early Proton Beam Radiation, because the cancer has not spread after treatment. (www.proton-therapy.org/amastudy.htm)
